#### Guidelines to Ensure Pediatric Readiness in Prehospital Settings

This joint policy statement from AAP/ ACEP/NAEMSP/NAEMT is currently in final review. The technical report that is to accompany it is in editing by all the organizations. These companion documents will support EMSC PM 02 and 03 as well as the pediatric education in both core and continuing education.



Remember 1/1/2018 Maryland Law requires all homes to have 10 year lithium batteries for smoke alarms

- 5. Applies knowledge learned in a first aid class
- 6. Performs CPR and/or uses an AED effectively
- 7. Knows his or her medical history (allergies, medications, special needs, etc.) and shares this information with emergency care providers
- 8. Participates in fire and injury prevention education in the community
- 9. Prepares, with his or her family, to respond to a disaster
- 10. Provides emergency assistance in the community



The categories of Maryland Star of Life, Maryland EMS Citizen, EMS Provider of the Year, and EMD Provider of the Year relate to specific incidents occurring from January 1, 2017, through December 31, 2017. Multiple awards may be presented.

#### **MARYLAND STAR OF LIFE AWARD**

This award may be given to an individual, multiple individuals, or teams on the same incident for an outstanding rescue under extreme circumstances by EMS personnel.

#### **MARYLAND EMS CITIZEN AWARD**

This award is intended for citizen rescuers who have demonstrated quick thinking, fast action, and heroism.

#### **EMS PROVIDER OF THE YEAR**

For a provider who has made outstanding contributions in the past year to the continuous improvement of emergency medical services in Maryland (for example, in the areas of quality assurance, public or EMS education, prevention, delivery of EMS services, and new technology).

#### **EMD PROVIDER OF THE YEAR**

This award is given for extraordinary efforts in assisting the public through dispatch in this vital portion of the Chain of Survival.

#### **OUTSTANDING EMS PROGRAM**

For a program that offers an innovative approach to reducing death and disability. The program must be affiliated with an EMS system component, such as a hospital, educational facility, rescue squad, or EMS organization.

#### LEON W. HAYES AWARD FOR LIFETIME EXCELLENCE IN EMS

This award is given to an individual who has devoted a lifetime of dedication to excellence in patient care, compassion and respect for each patient, and commitment to continuous improvement of the Maryland EMS system through his/her professional and personal life.

#### **MARYLAND EMS-CHILDREN (EMS-C) AWARD**

This award is given for an adult or program that has demonstrated ongoing dedication and commitment to improving the care for children and for promoting Family Centered Care in a Maryland EMS program or hospital.

#### **MARYLAND EMS-GERIATRIC (EMS-G) AWARD**

PEMAC UPDATE: January 3, 2018
The CPS & OP Healthcare Project

Since the last PEMAC meeting the project coordinator:

- Promoted the new MDH policy/regulation change that permits Medicaid coverage of special needs car seats. Information shared with Maryland AAP (~600 pediatricians), MD Occupational Therapists Association (~125 at their conf), all CPSTs in Maryland with special needs training, PEMAC meeting, EMS providers who read the EMS News, and other locations. Posted information on my CPS website.
- Staffed a CPS display at the Maryland Emergency Nursing Association Memorial Conference. About 60 nurses were in attendance. Provided materials on CPS and special needs OP to the Maryland Occupational Therapists annual conference, which is attended by approximately 125 OTs.
- Arranged to have a speaker on CPS for Peninsula Regional Medical Center's Pediatric Grand Rounds on April 12, 2018.
- Met on 12/13/17 with 12 risk management staff at Shady Grove Adventist Hospital and its affiliates to give a presentation on hospitals and CPS—roles and liability issues.
- Received the presentation and audio for the webinar, "Overview of 21<sup>st</sup> Century Technology for CPS" which was supposed to be broadcast on September 13 but had audio problems. Will post it on the MIEMSS CPS webpage and re-promote it for Maryland CPSTs to view and obtain CEUs for their recertification.
- Help at three NICU recertification site visits: 11/15/17 at Anne Arundel Medical Center, 11/16/17 at JH Bayview Medical Center, and 12/12/17 at UM Prince Georges Hospital Center. Met with key NICU and MCH staff to discuss CPS. Gave a CPST/NICU RN at PGHC a box of CPS handouts for their families.
- Gave a car bed to Mercy Medical Center's NICU, and a BubbleBum booster seat to the winner of the drawing at the ENA conference.
- Helped at three safety seat checks during this period: two for Safe Kids-Baltimore (one as part of the Graco grant) and one as part of the Baltimore County Seat Check schedule, in Parkville.
- Wrote and had published an article in the Maryland EMS News on safer air/train/bus travel with kids.
- Worked on the drowsy driving grant: finalizing the table tents and stand up banner design, and incentive item designs. Created promotions for a speaker on drowsy driving to give a lecture on February 9 at Shock Trauma/University of Maryland Medical Center. Gave STC materials for their drowsy driving display on November 9<sup>th</sup>. Finalized social media and sought estimates for the production of the table tents, magnets, coffee cup holders and stand up banner.
