PEMAC UPDATE --Jan 5, 2022 The CPS & OP Healthcare Project

- The CPS project to distribute car seats to needy families in hospitals continues:
 - 12 emergency departments are currently partners. UM Baltimore-Washington Medical Center and Christiana Care Union Hospital are the latest participants.
 - 5 newborn nurseries or NICUs are participants. In this quarter the new participants are Christiana Care Union Hospital and Shady Grove Adventist Hospital. Additionally, Holy Cross Germantown, UM BWMC, Medstar Harbor Hospital, and Medstar Franklin Square are considering participation. In the last several weeks UM Capital Regional Medical Center and Shady Grove Adventist have needed a number of car seats for recent immigrants as well as others.
 - Five other agencies are participating; two fire/EMS agencies (Talbot County Dept of Emergency Services as well as a new partner, Prince Georges Fire & Rescue) plus Safe Kids-Howard County, JHCC/Peds Trauma's Injury Prevention Program, and the Rubin Institute at Sinai Hospital.
- Helped at one car seat distribution with MD Kids in Safety Seats.
- Helped teach a Child Passenger Safety Technician course at the Clarksville Fire Department with 10 people attending. Anyone interested in upcoming courses can go to www.cert.safekids.org to get automated alerts when new classes are scheduled. Scholarships for the \$95 registration fee are available on a limited basis.
- Conducted an exhibit at the Maryland Assoc of School Health Nurses conference and an on-line exhibit (with live interactive sessions) for the Maryland Occupational Therapists conference.
- Posted a number of social media messages on traffic safety themes.
- Distributed nearly all the stand up banners on occupant protection to Maryland (or DC) trauma centers along with other materials on a thumb drive. These will help them with staff or community education.
- In-person car seat assistance is slowly resuming around the state, but virtual assistance options will continue. Contact Maryland Kids in Safety Seats at <u>https://tinyurl.com/VidAppt20</u> or <u>cps@miemss.org</u>.
