









FIRE LAWS OF MARYLAND

13-103. FIRE AND RESCUE INSTITUTE

- (a) Established - There is a Maryland Fire and Rescue Institute in the University of Maryland.
- (b) Executive Director
 - (1) The head of the Institute is the Executive Director
 - (2) The Executive Director-
 - (i) *shall report directly to the President of University of Maryland at College Park; and*
 - (ii) *may adopt rules and regulations necessary to carry out this section.*
- (c) Duties of Institute - The Institute shall:
 - (1) Provide classroom education and training for career and volunteer fire and rescue personnel, both at the Institute and throughout this State;
 - (2) Cooperate with other agencies that provide training for fire and rescue personnel;
 - (3) Train instructors;
 - (4) Prepare or adopt materials for training fire and rescue personnel;
 - (5) Develop new fire and rescue training techniques.

FIRE LAWS OF MARYLAND

13-103. FIRE AND RESCUE INSTITUTE *(continued)*


- (6) Develop and implement specialized courses in fire fighting, including industrial fire fighting;
- (7) Maintain statistics and records on fire and rescue education, training, and related matters;
- (8) Develop programs to inform the public about the tasks performed by fire and rescue personnel;
- (9) Establish guidelines for instructional material to school systems in the State concerning fire and rescue education;
- (10) Provide disaster training for fire and rescue personnel; and
- (11) cooperate with the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems to provide basic training for rescue personnel and emergency medical technicians.

(d) Funding - The Institute shall have the funds provided in the state budget.







PEARSON VUE TESTING



With assistance from our partners, MFRI established Pearson VUE test centers at all six regional training areas statewide and at MFRI headquarters.

This was done to enhance the EMT testing process and alleviate the scheduling and travel issues associated with National Registry testing.

Now cognitive testing is once again a part of the EMT class.

MISSION

Focus the talents and existing resources of the many University of Maryland sections and state/federal agencies to foster innovative technologies/practices to improve planning, response, mitigation, and recovery from the various types of domestic incidents.



PARTNERSHIPS

- MFRI is working with the A. James Clark School of Engineering at UMD to develop self-powered self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) for firefighters.
- Collaborating with UMD's Department of Fire Protection Engineering, MFRI is supporting the testing of an innovative drone created to compete in a global wildfire firefighting challenge.
- In support of the Governor's Maryland Corps/Service Year Option, MFRI is training young adults to become first responders through a yearlong, paid opportunity.
