




Length of Stay



Fall Recovery & Prevention Program

FRaPP is a wraparound service that supports patients after a fall by connecting them to tailored community resources.



- Goal:** Reduce future fall risk and aid recovery after discharge from Shock Trauma.
- Eligibility:** Patients with traumatic injuries from falls, primarily those discharging home.
- Services:** Personalized resources (home modifications, aging services, rehab providers, food access) and follow-up calls from a fall recovery navigator.

Who gets referred?

- All victims of violence (GSW, Stabbing, Assault) discharged home from TRU ONLY

How and Where are they seen?

in-person in the STOP on Thursday mornings

Services Provided?

- Medical care by APPs
- Integrative care
- Mental health counseling
- Case management services following discharge
- Referrals to community resources
- Legal support (Advocacy, legal information, and court accompaniment)







Goal	Current Status
Offer public STB trainings in ALL Maryland Counties	20/24 counties achieved by Q2
Partner with Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) to implement Bleeding Control as a requirement of High School Health Education	Nov 4 – MSDE unanimously approved draft revisions to Comprehensive Health Education Regulation Framework- open for public comment now
Increase partnerships with high-risk occupational organizations to promote STB training (ie. Construction, road crews, electricians, etc.)	<p>Trainings completed/scheduled for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Baltimore City Schools bus drivers • Assoc. of Firearm Examiners • Concrete General • Maryland Arborist Assoc.



Major Progress: Implementing Bleeding Control in MSDE Comprehensive Health Framework

- Nov 4 – MD State Board of Education *unanimously approved* draft revisions to Comprehensive Health Education Regulation Framework.
- Public Comment Period open through **February 9, 2026**
- Effective 2027/2028 school year.
- Shock Trauma Team supporting schools with curriculum resources, elbow support, and equipment procurement.
