RE: Maryland EMS Naloxone Grant Program – Year II

The Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems (MIEMSS), in conjunction with the Maryland Department of Health's Behavioral Health Administration, is pleased to announce a second year of funding to provide compensation to Maryland's jurisdictional EMS operational programs for uncompensated naloxone usage. This funding is available to all jurisdictional EMS operational programs that have purchased naloxone during fiscal year 2018 (July 2017 – June 2018). Programs may apply for any amount up to their maximum grant award listed on the attached grant application. This amount is based upon a jurisdiction's treat-no-transport naloxone usage during FY 2018, as contained in eMEDS®. Completed grant applications and proof of purchase must be received by midnight March 1st, 2019.
