2024 Operating Budget/Capital Project

TOTAL OPERATING BUDGET: \$11.2 Million

MFRI was awarded a **\$500,000 AFG Grant** to assist the Institute in obtaining equipment needed for training and protecting emergency personnel.

MFRI used the grant to purchase the following equipment for its six regional training centers:

Turnout gear, ground ladders, nozzles/appliances, a self-contained breathing apparatus, respirator fit testing equipment, firefighting props and rope rescue tools.





CAPITAL PROJECT:

Western Maryland Regional Training Center

The \$8.6 million renovation project features:

- A 3,200-square-foot addition provides two classrooms to serve the growing population.
- 2,329 square foot burn building was remodeled
- A new storage unit
- New propane props
- New testing center

The project is in the final stages of completion.
