Under 30 lbs	Rear-facing infant or convertible	Rear-facing infant or convertible	N/A
30-40 lbs	Rear-facing infant or convertible	Rear-facing infant or convertible until outgrown, then forward-facing harness seat	Forward-facing harness seat until outgrown then belt-positioning booster
40-80 lbs	N/A	Forward-facing harness seat. For special needs or children less than 2 years old, see **.	Forward-facing harness seat until outgrown, then belt-positioning booster.
80-100 lbs	N/A	Special needs car seats or harnesses.	Belt-positioning booster if child doesn't pass the '5 Step Test' for seat belt fit.

Car seats & seat belts: Everyone on every ride!

Maryland law requires use of a seat belt or car seat by all passengers in all seats. Each adult that is not buckled up may receive a ticket of \$83 for not wearing a seat belt. Every child under age 8 must ride in an appropriate car seat unless the child is 4'9" or taller. A driver with children not in car seats would get an \$83 ticket.
